Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

Echo Hill's School-wide behavior expectations, response and interventions

All Linn Mar elementary schools are trained in PBIS, which is a program that aligns buildingwide behavior expectations, along with extra interventions or supports for students who need more practice with these life skills. You may hear your child talk about certain features of PBIS:

- 1. **ROAR** Echo Hill's four expectations are **R**espect, **O**utstanding Leader, **A**wesome Attitude and **R**esponsible.
- 2. **Expectation Areas** We practice what is expected in the Hallway, Lunchroom, Assemblies, Bathrooms, Playground, Bus/Car Rider areas, and Classrooms. Posters with these expectations are posted in those locations.
- 3. **ROAR tickets** When students are showing positive behavior choices they intermittently receive a ROAR ticket. Tickets go in a class bucket for room privileges and also end up in the building Big Bin where we all work together to earn a celebration.
- 4. **Celebrations** As a building, we combine our earned ROAR tickets and when we hit our goal we celebrate. So far this year, our celebrations have been a Dance Party, Staff Pie in the Face, Bingo, Flashlights and Forts, and Beach Day.

Our April event is **"Roaring for Recess"** – each grade level is working to earn 300 tickets, which will earn them an extra 15 minute recess. The more earned, the greater a chance for more than one extra recess!

5. Supports – When a student needs more practice with positive behavior choices, they may begin a six week "Check in, Check out (CICO)" daily progress report. The report shows the expectations and gives the students points each period of the day. Teachers discuss the scores with the student and the student also has a special mentor who checks in with them at the beginning and end of the day to encourage their progress.

Questions for you to ask your student:

- 1. What does ROAR stand for? (Respect, Outstanding Leader, Awesome Attitude and Responsible)
- 2. How could you show ROAR at home or community activities?
- 3. What was your favorite PBIS celebration this year?
