## 3rd Quarter

### Grades for 3rd Quarter Classes:

Grades for 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter classes will be due for teachers on Tuesday, April 13, at 4:30 p.m. Grades will be finalized approximately two weeks following. In most instances, the grades you see on PowerSchool starting on April 14, will be the final 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter grade.

## 4th Quarter

## <u>Serious Threat – Intruder Review on Wednesday during 2<sup>nd</sup> Block/4<sup>th</sup> Period – Bell will ring at 11:30 a.m.:</u>

The bell to release 2<sup>nd</sup> Block/4<sup>th</sup> Period will ring at 11:30 a.m. on Wednesday, April 14, (not the normal 11:27 a.m.) so that a short presentation and review can take place for students regarding what to do in the event of a Serious Threat or Intruder on campus. We will not be sprinting to exit everyone out of the building or blockading classrooms for a drill this year in order to maintain our current COVID precautions, but we will be reviewing needed student and staff actions to take for such a situation.

#### New Parking Permit 'Freeze' through this Week:

At this time, we are instituting a parking permit 'Freeze' for any new parking permit requests through next week. With the increase in students coming in 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter, we want to ensure that we have enough parking spaces throughout the day. We do know that the Far North Lot and the Northeast Stadium Lot (north of the Aquatic Center) still have parking spaces available at all times each day. We also know these are not the most desirable spaces as they are farthest from the school. After April 19, we may restart issuing new parking passes beginning with any 12<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> Grades requests. Students, of any grade level, who already have a parking permit are not affected by this 'Freeze' as it is only for the issuing of new parking permit tags.

## Food Court will return to 11th and 12th Grades Students Only during Lunch for 4th Quarter:

Starting on April 12, the Food Court will return to 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> Grades Students only during lunch. (The Food Court has been reserved for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> Grades Students during past years). Seating will still be limited to what is in the Food Court and distancing will remain in place in both the Food Court and South Commons/Cafeteria at all times including lunch.

Unless requested, students will maintain their current designation as either Online-Only, Hybrid, or Every Day for 4th Quarter.

Process for Opting to Come to School Every Day for the Start of 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter and at Any Time During 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter:

Students wishing to start Every Day attendance for 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter may do so by having parents contact either the 9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup>

Grades Office (447-4043, 447-3050), 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> Grades Office (447-3070, 447-3046), or the Main Office (447-3040)

between now and the end of the day on April 9. At any time during 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter that a student wishes to start attending

Every Day, they may do so by having parents let the 9th-10th Grades Office, 11th-12th Grades Office, or the Main Office know by 1:00 p.m. the day prior to returning Every Day so that teachers can be made aware and will be expecting your student.

The process for students wishing to go to Online-Only has not changed. Parents will need to notify Associate Superintendent Nathan Wear (Nathan.wear@linnmar.k12.ia.us) for any student to change to Online-Only.

#### LMHS 4th Quarter Hybrid Schedule:

The current LMHS 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter Hybrid Schedule will be maintained during 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter. We now refer to the schedule as the LMHS 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Hybrid Schedule.

Linn-Mar High School Hybrid Daily Schedule for 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Ouarter 2020-21

A reminder to students that RTI2 and RTI3 can be mandated by teacher request. If you are requested to RTI2 or RTI3 you are expected to attend the session for that given day. Students may also choose to attend any RTI session on any day.

## Changes in CDC Guidance in Classroom Settings:

Many of you are aware that the CDC has adjusted guidance for schools concerning distancing within the classroom setting. The new guidance **allows for 3' between student seating in a classroom** (this has been 6'). At this time, our intention will be to make adjustments within classrooms as needed, from 6' to 3', starting in 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter (April 12). (We will maintain the maximum distance within the classroom unless student numbers dictate a need to lower the distance to no less than 3'). This is *only in the classroom setting* and **all other precautions will remain in place**, **including mask wearing at all times and social distancing in all other areas of the school building** (e.g. commons areas, cafeteria).

#### Information Regarding 4th Quarter:

- a. The current daily schedule (used for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter) will be used for all of 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter. This maintains the two RTI sessions (11:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.).
- b. Campus Release (with parent approval) will continue during 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter so that students only have to be on campus during class time. We anticipate this also helping minimize the number of students during lunch hour which makes social distancing easier to maintain.
- c. Current Parking will remain the same at the start of 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter. We will monitor parking closely. Should numbers of students coming Every Day increase dramatically, we may implement more restrictions.

#### Campus Release Reminders for 4th Quarter:

- 9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> Grade students with campus release may leave the building during periods/blocks with no scheduled class (schedule says "Campus Release"), RTI (if not requested), and during lunch.
- 9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> Grade students who choose to stay during your Campus Release period must report to the Learning Center (cannot be in the commons areas). 9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> Grade students who are not requested by a teacher yet choose to stay for RTI (always encouraged) must report to your 2nd block/4th period class for the morning RTI session and to your 4th block/8th period class for the afternoon RTI session.
- 9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> Grade students choose to stay for lunch may only go to assigned lunch period. Students must then report to the 2<sup>nd</sup> block/4<sup>th</sup> period classroom or to the Learning Center opposite their lunch period.

#### LMHS Senior Prom on May 15:

The LMHS Senior Prom (w/approved guests) for the Class of 2021 will be held on Saturday, May 15, from 8:00 – 11:00 p.m. in the LMHS Main Gym. The Grand March will begin at 7:30 p.m. and will be livestreamed this year. Tickets for Prom will go on sale in the South Commons, May 11 – May 13, from 8:15 – 8:55 a.m. All students must be in 'good standing' in order to purchase Prom tickets. 'Good Standing' means all fines must be paid, all time is made up, and any other school obligations are taken care of prior to purchasing a Prom ticket.

#### A Note from the Post Prom Committee:

The 2021 Linn-Mar Post Prom is scheduled for Saturday, May 15, 2021, from 11:30 p.m. to 4:00 a.m. at the ImOn Ice Arena in Cedar Rapids. Post Prom is organized and run by parent volunteers, with acknowledgment and support of the Linn-Mar Administration. All Linn-Mar seniors are invited to attend, regardless of whether they attend Prom. Prom guests registered through the school can attend with seniors. The event is designed to provide a safe space for students to enjoy Prom night and includes raffles, games, prizes, food, and skating. Students must arrive by 12:30 a.m. and student IDs are required. Generous community and parent support and donations make this event a success by allowing us to provide food, entertainment, and prizes, which keep the students entertained and in the building. PowerHouse in downtown Cedar Rapids. A comment on tickets: Seating for Commencement is still fluid at this time and has led to our hesitancy to state a specific number of tickets per graduate. This is actually a good thing as the possibility of increased seating by the end of May exists as the percentage of vaccinations continues to rise in Linn County and as the number of COVID cases remains at a low rate. (a note: If the rodeo happens at the arena in early May, that is a good sign regarding seating capacity for Commencement). Our goal is to have at least four tickets per graduate for Commencement. On April 13, we cannot say each graduate can have four tickets. However, we are hopeful given the response to getting vaccinations in Linn County and with more than six weeks remaining we will be able to meet, and possibly exceed, this number of tickets per graduate. We will continue to provide updates as they are determined and as we get closer to the event.
