### **Band News**

#### 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Band

The 5th Grade Band will give its Spring Concert on Tuesday, May 2nd. The concert will be held in the HS Auditorium and begin at 6:15 p.m. All band students should report to the HS Little Theatre



between 5:45 - 6:00 p.m. The program will last about 30 minutes. Nice dress clothes should be worn for this MAJOR performance. In preparation for the Concert, we will be rehearsing together THAT MORNING at L-M HS. Please drop your student off at the HS Auditorium Main Entrance (circle drive) between 7:15 - 7:20 am for our 7:30 - 8:30 am rehearsal. Students will be bused to school after the rehearsal. Since this is our only chance to practice together before our concert it is very important that ALL Band students attend.

Current 5th Grade Band students are able to sign up for the Summer Band Program. They can participate in Program #2 - Private Band Lessons. Students receive a weekly, 15-minute individual lesson with a MS Band Director for 6 weeks. Program #2 will run from June 5th - July 14th. 5<sup>th</sup> Grade students can also participate in the 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Band Camp - Program 3.5. This is a Group Band experience directed by Mrs. Nuss that meets daily from 8:00 - 9:00 am Mon - Fri for two weeks beginning June 5th. This year all of the Summer Band Programs will be held at Oak Ridge MS. Sign up forms will be sent home with band students in late April and will be due by May 19th. If you don't see one before our May concert we will have extra's available there...

#### Beginning Band for Current 4th Graders - THE BAND IS COMING!!!

All 4th graders will meet during late April to see a Band instrument demonstration, and try out some instruments. On April 26<sup>th</sup> they will hear the 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Band and MS Chamber Orchestra perform. It is a very exciting time to be a 4<sup>th</sup> Grader! Students will be bringing home information about the band program, instrument choices, and parent meetings at that time.

Informational meetings for Parents of 4th Graders who would like to start a band instrument are being scheduled for Monday, May 1st and Wednesday, May 3rd at 6:00 PM. Meetings will be held in the High School Little Theatre and last about 45 minutes. Parents only need to attend one meeting and your child does not need to attend. At the meeting parents will receive information about the 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Band program and our Summer Beginner lessons. Parents will also sign their child up for an individual 15 minute *Band Interview* to try out instruments (with parents in attendance). **NOTE: All beginner band students MUST interview to select an Instrument**. In March, our students earned a whole-school Beach Day on the Friday before spring break by filling the fish tank with paw prints. Students got to wear their favorite beach clothes, sunglasses, hats, flip-flops, and they brought towels to sit on. Fun activities were planned, and students got to eat sack lunches on the floor of the lunch room! If students are able to fill the fish tank again in April, the Wilkins Way team will hold a special assembly at the end of the month which will include a contest involving students and staff. Students are encouraged to keep up the awesome behavior so we can fill that fish tank!

## Grade Level News:



<u>Kindergarten News</u>: It is hard to believe that it is already April! This year has gone by quickly! Our kindergarteners have been busy in math learning about money. We have been working on the names of the coins and how much they are worth. We have also been reviewing measuring with different objects and working with patterns. We have been

working on improving our addition and subtractions skills using story problems. **Reading:** We are continuing to work on Heggerty focusing on rhyming, adding phonemes, deleting phonemes, final sounds in words, onset sounds and blends. The student are showing a tremendous amount of growth in these areas. We are using Braidy each week with our retelling and story comprehension. Braidy helps us identify the characters and their feelings throughout the story, the kickoff event, the setting, events and the tie up because of the kickoff event. The students enjoy using Braidy each week and it has helped with our retelling and comprehension. *Science*: We are starting our animals 2x2 unit. Throughout this unit we will explore goldfish, guppies, snails, bird, worms and isopods. The students have already had a great time exploring these different animals.

<u>First Grade News</u>: First graders are learning about life science with our unit about "Plants and Animals". We have planted two kinds of grass (alfalfa and rye), we planted a wheat seed inside of a straw, we also did stem cuttings and soon we will be "mowing" our lawns!

We continue to work in our Journeys reading books, and we have been reading a lot of informational texts and doing plenty of writing. We are nearing the end of our unit 5 of Journeys, with just one more unit left to do this school year. In math, we are on Unit 8, which works on money and making change. We will also learn about fair shares and basic fractions (halves, thirds, and fourths).

All of the first graders are getting excited about our Junior Achievement lessons beginning very soon! Our grade level will learn about jobs, wants & needs, maps, and other fun things. We are very grateful for our JA volunteers! <u>Second Grade News</u>: What fun we are having in 2nd grade. Lots of fun and learning is ahead for our 2nd graders in our plants and insects unit. We even have some visitors in our rooms, meal worms. In math we have started working on fractions and measurement. In social studies we talked about people around the world and all the cultures, traditions and customs they have. In April we will be starting Junior Achievement. It's hard to believe the year is winding down.

<u>Third Grade News:</u> April is sure to be one of our busiest months yet. We will kick off the month with Iowa Assessments. Math will introduce multiplying two- and three-digit numbers using the lattice method and the partial products algorithm. Students should continue working on their math fact fluency! Social studies has wrapped up for the year. We just completed our Maps and Globes Unit. Students memorized the 7 different continents and 5 oceans. We are working on a science unit called Structures of Life. In this unit, students will be able to identify properties of plants and animals and sort organisms based on their properties. We are awaiting the arrival of live crayfish to help us learn all about this! We write for so many different purposes, and this month the focus is narrative. Students will be participating in a swim experience at the Linn-Mar Aquatic Center the week of April 17th. More information to come. Please encourage your child to continue to find time to read as the weather starts to get warmer.

**Fourth Grade News:** 4<sup>th</sup> grade is flying by! We wrapped up our Iowa Assessments on April 6, and now we're gearing up for the rest of the year. Our math units start to go by quickly- you can expect an assessment at least every two weeks, but the nice thing is we are now applying skills we learned in the first half of the year. We have wrapped up our final social studies units and are working on our final project for the end of the year. In science, we've begun our environments unit, which comes with lots of crawling critters! As always, continue to practice spelling at home at least three nights a week, and keep reading 20 minutes each night- NWEA is right around the corner and this makes such a big difference!

**Fifth Grade News:** April is a busy month for the fifth graders. In math, students will find the area of rectangles, volume of rectangular prisms, and they will use formulas to find the area of triangles and parallelograms. In literacy, students will complete informative writing. In reading, the focus of instruction will be on how to analyze the text by drawing conclusions and generalizations, using text and graphic features, and understanding theme. The primary focus of Pride, our intervention block, will be literacy skills. In social studies, students will continue to learn about the New England, Middle, and Southern Colonies. Science instruction will include either Sun, Moon, and Planets, or Living Systems. At the end of the month, all students will start their study of the reproductive unit. The first week will include learning about the male reproductive system, and the second week will include learning about the female reproductive system. Fifth graders will also have a one day swim experience at the Aquatic Center. We will also begin our transition to the middle school by having one of the Excelsior counselors visit each classroom to discuss next school year.

#### RULES

- Each participant will enter two running events and one field event. 1.
- There will be a boys' and girls' division in every event except the 400 Mixed Relay, which has an alternating boy / girl order. 2.
- Ribbons will be awarded for the first six places in the individual events and relays. 3.
- The number of entries in each event will be limited. Places are based on time and distance. 4.
- There will be two tries for the long jump, frisbee throw, soccer punt, football throw, and softball throw. There will only be one 5. trial in the soccer dribble.
- 6. The Soccer Dribble consists of zig-zagging the ball with the feet around three cones and back across the finish line. Cones are 10 yards apart.
- 7. Participants will sit in the stands listening for their races and cheering on their classmates.
- Wear comfortable clothing and running shoes on the day of the meet. NO SPIKES! Wear sunscreen too! 8.
- 9. Small water bottles will be allowed, but NO COOLERS!
- 10. Students will need to bring a sack lunch with them to the track. Please no glass containers, gum, or soda pop. If would like to get a sack lunch from school, please indicate below that you would like your child to have a sack lunch from school. Bring bottom part back to school by April 21<sup>st</sup>, 2017.
