### Too Sick for School?

Each day many parents are faced with a decision:

Should they keep their sick children home or send them off to school? The following guidelines, recommended by experts at the Mayo Clinic, should be considered when making this sometimes difficult decision. A student should remain home when he/she:

- \*vomits or has diarrhea in the last 24 hours
- \*has an oral temperature of 100 degrees or higher
- \*coughs almost constantly or complains of difficult breathing
- \*has sores on mouth or skin that are crusty, yellow or draining
- \*displays an unexplained skin rash or red eye (with or without crusting/drainage)

Crossing Guard Change: Beginning in December there will be no crossing guard on duty at the 35<sup>th</sup> Street/McGowan intersection, during the morning time frame. There will still be a crossing guard at this intersection for the after school time frame. This change will continue through the winter season. We will go back to having the morning crossing guard at this intersection in the Spring.

# Thinking Ahead to Cold Winter Weather

Students should bring the following winter clothing EVERY DAY once winter hits. Even if there is no snow on the ground, the wind is cold and the ground is damp.

### GRADE LEVEL NEWS

<u>Kindergarten:</u> Kindergarteners have completed their Jolly Phonics program and are now using these sounds in their reading and writing. Guided reading small groups are going well and they are all building confidence in themselves and their reading abilities. Please continue to practice the rainbow sight words at home! The kids have enjoyed learning how to play many math games

during math time. These games are beneficial to them because they are interacting with their peers and learning lifelong math skills at the same time! Some of the games they have learned are Monster Squeeze, Spin a Number and Roll and record. We are still working on our Materials and Motion unit in Science. We will continue that through December. All classes are working hard at following The Wilkins Way. The teachers are always looking for reasons to hand out paw prints and the kids are doing a great job at being safe, respectful, responsible and ready! Keep it up Kindergarteners!!!

First Grade: First graders are working hard in their third unit of Journeys. We have gotten into our routine of whole group and small group reading/literacy time each day, and the students are really enjoying their guided reading groups! We are learning about different genres of books, such as informational texts, fantasy stories, realistic fiction, and fairy tales/fables. We are also learning about and applying many writing skills to our everyday work. In math, we are well into our fourth unit. Measurement is the main concept taught in this unit, and students have been learning about standard and non-standard units of measure, using rulers and tape measures to find lengths and heights, and why using our bodies to measure things isn't usually the most reliable thing to do. We are also beginning to learn about telling time to the quarter-hour. Our next science unit, light and sound, is here. We are very excited to begin learning all about it during December and January! We will be using flashlights, learning about shadows, playing and making some musical instruments, and learning about volume and pitch. The first grade music program on the evening of November 30<sup>th</sup>, "Twas the Night Before Christmas", was a wonderful program for everyone to enjoy! The students did a fantastic job, and they looked like they had a great time, too. All of the children looked so great in their fancy outfits!


Second Grade: These 2<sup>nd</sup> graders have been busy! We finished our air and weather unit for science and received our new solids and liquids unit. We will begin the new kit in a few weeks. Currently we are working on units 2 and 3 of social studies. A lot of great discussions are happening about the earth, its rotation, seasons, cardinal directions, and reading maps. During math time, the kiddos have been practicing ballpark estimates, double digit addition, measurements, and working with money. After the holiday break, math will really start to pick up. We will work more on polygons, plotting line segments, and using subtraction to find the difference between numbers. We are reading every day and continuing to work on accuracy, fluency, and comprehension. Please continue to have your student read each night for 20 minutes (or more). Thank you for all that you do to help them

learn and grow!

Third Grade: 3rd graders are moving right along! In math, we have completed Unit 4 which was learning about multiplication and division! In social studies we are finishing up our unit about Communities. 3rd graders have become familiar with the similarities and differences in suburban, rural, and urban communities. We will continue with social studies and learn a bit about government! The students continue working on great sentence and paragraph structure in writing. The most recent type of writing learned was opinion writing. The students have done a great job creating strong opinion statements and reasons to support those opinions. One of our favorite writing activities has been to persuade the farmer that they are not Thanksgiving turkeys! Keep reading and logging those minutes! Thanks to the parents and families for their support! We are looking forward to December and all that it brings.

Fourth Grade: Fourth graders wrapped up the first trimester! We've recently completed our Northeast Region in Social Studies and will begin to learning about the Southeast Region. We've been working hard on some very creative persuasive writing pieces. In math, we're growing in our math skills, and are now applying our basic multiplication facts to extended, multi-digit problems. And finally, Invention Convention is almost here! This is an exciting event in 4<sup>th</sup> grade and we look forward to seeing the creativity of each student and what they invented! Mark your calendars to join us for Invention Convention the afternoon of Friday, December 7. As always, keep encouraging your child to read 20 minutes each night and keep practicing those math facts!

Fifth Grade: In math, we recently finished unit 5, which included comparing fractions and converting improper fractions to mixed numbers and mixed numbers to improper fractions. In unit 6, we will be adding and subtracting fractions, while finding common denominators. Skills and strategies taught in reading this month include: drawing conclusions and generalizations, sequence of events, and compare and contrast. In writing, students are completing persuasive essays. The focus of instruction in social studies this trimester is European Explorers. Students will know why Europeans explored different areas of the world, routes they followed, and how they changed the lives of Native Americans. In science this trimester, students are completing the kit, Mixtures and solutions. Investigation 1 has students making and separating mixtures. Students become engineers by solving problems during their hands-on experiments.


# The Reading Team Presents: December Book Picks!



Mrs. Brown's Pick of the Month!

<u>Amulet Book One: The Stonekeeper</u> by Kazu Kibuishi: <u>The Stonekeeper</u> is the first graphic novel in a series of seven books (the 8th and the 9th and final book are currently being written). In <u>The Stonekeeper</u>, we are introduced to Emily, who is destined to find the Amulet and go on an intense and often scary adventure to rescue her mother. She has help along the way from her brother, Navin, and a group of kind and compassionate characters. As she discovers the powers of the Amulet and her new, unknown world, she has more questions than answers. People who enjoy fantasy, adventure, and a well-developed story with amazing illustrations

will love The Amulet series. The grade level listed for this book is grades 3-7, but the vocabulary may be hard for some kids in 3rd and 4th grade. Adults who enjoy fantasy would also like this series.



Mrs. Wells' Pick of the Month!

<u>Snowball</u>, a book from <u>The Puppy Place</u> series, by Ellen Miles - where every puppy finds a forever home! Charles & Lizzie Peterson are very good with dogs. They want one of their own, but their mom isn't ready for them to have one full time. For now, they help take care of puppies that need to find a new home. They are a foster family for young dogs. The Peterson kids hear about Snowball. Someone left the fluffy puppy all alone at a gas station in a tattered, old box. Snowball is sick and hungry. He needs a family of his own. Can Charles and Lizzie find one that is just right?" This book takes place during the weeks between Thanksgiving and Christmas, making now a perfect time to read it! (The books in the series do not

need to be read in order; they are all great stand alone novels on their own.) This book centers around a Westie, but the series has books about many other kinds of dogs, too. Once your child gets started on <a href="The Puppy Place">The Puppy Place</a> series, they may want to read them all! This series is targeted especially for children reading at, or above, the 2nd grade level - as well as dog lovers of all ages! Any of the books in the series would make for a great read aloud at home as well.




Mrs. Gostonczik's Pick of the Month!

The Pigeon Needs a Bath by Mo Willems.

If you are searching for a high interest read aloud book, Mo Willems is my goto author. I don't know what it is about this series, but I am hooked. The pigeon is quite the animated character with a flair for the dramatic. Children (and adult children, like myself) get carried away with how much fun it is to

read! You won't believe the expression you will hear while listening to your child read any of the books in the series. Picture books are not just for young readers! My 5th graders love them! These books have great vocabulary and challenging words to explore. Some examples are: sensation, celebration, reflective, educational, recently, unimportant, impolite, purely, coincidental, etc. The target audience is listed as PreK-2, with guided reading levels ranging from G to J.



Mrs. Dalton's Pick of the Month!

If you are looking for a just right book for your first grader, I highly recommend the <u>Biscuit</u> books by <u>Alyssa Satin Capucilli</u>. The books are written at about a level 12 or G, which is a typical book level for mid to late first graders. The books are highly engaging with adorable illustrations that any pet lover is drawn to. The text has some repeated phrases to build fluency and confidence, but also gives children the opportunity to problem solve new words.

Best of all Biscuit is a series carried by Scholastic books, so they are available in soft cover and reasonably priced. Plus being a series, once your little one is hooked there are many titles to choose from. Enjoy!

#### Wilkins Guidelines for Volunteering for Classroom Parties




We are grateful and appreciative to have parents/volunteers to help at our school classroom parties. We are limited to the number of volunteers we are able to have in each classroom due to room space. Below are the guidelines and process we utilize for each of the classroom parties.

- \*\*Room Parents are assigned for each class by the volunteer coordinator for Wilkins Elementary. Room Parents will automatically be one of the volunteers that attend each party.
- \*\*The teacher of each classroom is responsible to choose any additional volunteers that will help for the classroom party. These volunteers must be an active registered volunteer.
- \*\*The teachers will provide the names to the office and the office will have name tags for the party volunteers. These are the only individuals that will be able to attend the party.
- \*\*Room parents are responsible for contacting volunteers to bring any needed supplies for the party. The volunteers bringing supplies are not automatically signed up to be a volunteer in the classroom for the party. They are only able to volunteer in the classroom if they made prior arrangements with the classroom teacher and are an active registered volunteer.
