LMHS is 1:1 in 2019-20

School-Issued Computers for LMHS Students

With a 'thank you' to the LM School Board for making this happen, LMHS will be 1:1 for the first time in 2019-20. On August 26, LMHS students will be issued a school computer with a silicon cover, power cord and adapter to use in courses during the year. Each unit will have a school barcode and student name tag. Students will be responsible for the care and handling of the unit assigned to them.

School computers are for academic purposes and students found to be in violation of district and building 1:1 policies may lose the privilege of having a student-issued computer. A specific 1:1 policy section has been added to the LMHS Student Handbook, and this section and the entire Student Handbook will be available to all students and parents on the HS website in early August.

All courses will be utilizing PowerSchool Learning this year to help students access and receive support for learning course objectives at any time with their school-issued computers. The school-issued computers will also be used for the ISASP (state testing) in April.

Students will return the computer, power cord, and adapter on their last day of each school year either prior to graduation rehearsal for 12th grade students or following their last final exam for 9th-11th grade students. At this time, the district will not be offering insurance for the school-issued computers.

9th Grade-Only 1st Day on Friday, August 23

LMHS 9th grade students will report for classes at 8:30 a.m. on Friday, August 23. Students will go through a specific 9th grade 1st Day Schedule and meet with teachers in all of their classes. The focus for the day will include topics of academic mindset, success and support, wayfinding, behavior expectations, building procedures, student assistance support, an activity fair, and lunch protocols and options.

All of our 230 LMHS staff will be directly involved with the 9th grade students during the day to help make for a successful start to 9th grade. This is a required day of school for all 9th grade students and attendance will be taken each period and block during the day.

The day will begin at 8:30 a.m. in 1st Period/1st Block. All students in Marching Band will have class at 7:15 a.m., and all before/after school practices, meetings or rehearsals will take place as normal on August 23.

Self-Guided Touring LMHS Prior To The School Year

LMHS will be open for students and parents to tour the building on your own beginning on Monday, August 5, from 7:30 a.m.–3:30 p.m.

We are extending hours for students and parents to tour and explore the building from 7:30 a.m.-7:30 p.m. on Monday, August 19, Tuesday, August 20, Wednesday, August 21, and Thursday, August 22.

We strongly encourage all students and parents to use the times the building will be open to find their way to classrooms and other specific locations within LMHS. Every year, Student Advisory Councils for all grade levels have strongly recommended that students new to LMHS, including all 9th grade students, use the opportunity to tour the building before the first day of school in order to feel more comfortable getting around when all of the students and staff return.

9th-11th Grades Student Pictures on August 21 and 22

School Pictures for 9th-11th Grades will be taken on Wednesday, August 21 from 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. and Thursday, August 22 from 11:30 a.m. -7:30 p.m. on the LMHS Auditorium stage.

Picture make-ups are scheduled for Friday, September 6, from 7:30 a.m. - 10:30 a.m.

***PLEASE NOTE: It is important that ALL students Grades 9-11 get their photos taken every year. If you do NOT want to purchase photos, the photographers will just take an "ID photo" at no charge.

LMHS Class of 2020 Photo Update

On August 27, during Homeroom at 10:00 a.m., 12th grade students will report to the field at LM Stadium to take a '2020' class picture. In 2012, during their 4th grade year, the Class of 2020 took a photo at LM Stadium at the start of the LMCSD initiative to have both academic goals and physical renovations completed by the time the Class of 2020 entered high school. To mark the uniqueness of the photo taken in 2012, we plan to update the picture with the current members of the Class of 2020. Band directors, as they did in 2012, and HS staff will be on hand to help line up the students for the photograph.

9th Grade Parent Only Orientation Wednesday, August 21 at 6:30 p.m.

An orientation night for 9th grade parents will be held on Wednesday, August 21, beginning at 6:30 p.m. in the LMHS Auditorium. Specific sessions will be offered regarding communication, student assistance - social emotional support, academic focus, homework-grading, the LMHS Student Handbook, and building tours. The evening will end around 8:00 p.m. Because the August 23 school day is 9th grade only, the 9th Grade Parent Orientation Night on the 21st is for parents only. No events will be planned for students on the 21st.

10th, 11th, 12th Grades Report on Monday, August 26

9th Grade students will be joined by 10th-12th grade students on Monday, August 26, at 8:30 a.m. A Homeroom Schedule will be used on August 26 and August 27. All students will report to Homeroom each day at 10:00 a.m.

Bus drop-off and boarding takes place on the north side of the building. Busses will depart from LMHS at approximately 3:40 p.m.

LMHS Parent Open House Replaced by Course Teacher Videos

With the addition of two parent conference dates and with approximately a 10% participation rate at Parent Open House, LMHS will be replacing the event with teacher videos for each course. The intention is to have a much higher percentage of parents able to get the course information from teachers. The course information in the videos will be similar to the information parents received during previous Parent Open House sessions. Teacher introductions, course information and expectations, contact information, and other necessary course information will be presented in the short, approximately two minute videos.

Teacher videos will be emailed to parents on August 28, the third day of school and the last day to add a course for 1st Quarter/1st Semester. The videos will also be on PowerSchool Learning.

E-Registration opens Mon., Aug. 5. All students must e-Register prior to the start of school.

'Sophomore Commons Release' During Scheduled Learning Center Time

For the second year, designated 10th grade students who have two previous semesters averaging a 3.33 g.p.a., have no Code of Conduct or Attendance issues, have no current 'F', 'D', or incomplete work grades, and have parent permission, may be assigned to specific 'commons' areas (West/Theatre Commons, Pride Rock Commons, Study Commons at the Main Office, and Upper Commons/Library) during scheduled Learning Center time. The South Commons and Lower Commons/Cafeteria will not be available for Sophomore Commons Release. 'Commons' seating for Sophomores with Commons Release will be designated and attendance will be taken daily. Any student granted Sophomore Commons Release and found leaving the building without permission or not in their designated commons area will have Sophomore Commons Release revoked with the student reassigned to the Learning Center.

FIVE HOMEROOM SESSIONS IN 2019-20

Five Homeroom sessions will be held during the 2019-20 school year. The Homeroom dates are August 26, August 27, October 31, January 23, and April 2.

Topics will include: Computer Distribution, Student Handbook 'points of emphasis', Harassment Procedures, Healthy Kids Act, 9th Grade Adjustment Sessions, Course Registration Planning, Graduation Planning, Post-Secondary Planning, Job Shadowing and Internship Planning, and information distribution. A separate Homeroom Schedule will be used on these five dates.

Homeroom is required of all students, and attendance will be taken at each session.

ACADEMIC LETTER ASSEMBLIES ON SEPTEMBER 5

Three Academic Assemblies will be held on Thursday, September 5. The 11th Grade assembly honoring Junior academic letter winners will begin at 9:00 a.m. The 12th Grade assembly will begin at 10:30 a.m. and the 10th Grade assembly will begin at 2:00 p.m. Each ceremony will take approximately forty minutes followed by pictures. All three assemblies occur in the LMHS Auditorium. Students in grades 10-12, who have a cumulative grade point average of 3.33 during the 2018-19 school year, will receive academic letters.

Students receiving a cumulative grade point average of 3.75 during the 2018-19 school year, are eligible to receive an academic letter "with Honors". Students receiving a cumulative grade point average of 4.00 during the 2018-19 school year are eligible to receive an academic letter "with Distinction".

ACADEMIC ASSEMBLY PARKING INFORMATION

Parking on campus is extremely limited. Attendees of the morning Academic Assemblies are asked to park at New Life Church (29th and Alburnett Road) and take the shuttle to LMHS. Bus shuttles will begin thirty minutes prior to each assembly. We do ask that all attendees enter LMHS through door #1 (near the Auditorium), which will be open for the assemblies only. No shuttle is available for the 2:00 p.m. Academic Assembly. Guests for the 10th Grade Academic Assembly are asked to park on campus or on the adjacent streets as able.

PSAT INFORMATION FOR JUNIORS

The PSAT National Merit Scholarship Competition exam will be given on Wednesday, October 16. Cost for the exam is \$15, and can be paid in the LMHS Cashier's Office. Exam sign-up is in the 11th/12th Grades Office. For information and questions regarding the PSAT, please contact the 11th/12th Grades Office (447-3070).

The National Merit Scholarship Competition is open to and encouraged for all interested Juniors. Interested Sophomores are also encouraged to take the exam as a practice for the PSAT during their Junior year.

The PSAT for Juniors is taken at the Kirkwood Regional Center in Hiawatha. The PSAT for Sophomores is taken in the Presentation-Lecture Hall at LMHS. Students need to report for the PSAT no later than 7:30 a.m.

NAVIANCE STUDENT AVAILABLE FOR LMHS STUDENTS AND PARENTS

Linn-Mar High School has partnered with Naviance to provide a variety of tools for student achievement through academic planning. These tools are located in **Naviance Student**, a website for students and families to access online resources, communicate with school staff, and collaborate on college and career readiness activities. Students can research colleges, scholarships, careers, enrichment programs and courses in one location. They can also create individual plans that can be linked to college and career readiness. Students can communicate easily with teachers and counselors.

For college and career readiness, students can request transcripts and recommendations for college applications, as well as complete career assessments and perform college and career searches. Students can also create goals and track associated tasks and activities.

Students can access Naviance Student on the LMHS web page using their network username and password. Parents of returning students have been issued a registration code to access Naviance Student. (https://student.naviance.com/linnmarhs). Parents of new students, including 9th grade students, will be issued a registration code to access Naviance Student.

'BLENDED' LEARNING COURSE SECTIONS

Approximately 50 of over 740 total LMHS course sections will be taught using a 'blended learning' format during the 2019-20 school year. The subjects are limited to specific sections of selected courses. Blended course offerings are courses created with a defined intent of utilizing the best face-to-face and digital instructional methods available to learning. Blended courses will meet at the same time daily, but will have variable expectations (always teacher-determined) regarding days of face-to-face attendance per week. At no time will students meet with their instructor less than three days per week and at no time will the expectations and rigor of a Blended class be less than that of a traditional course section. Students will be taught the same content, held to the same standards, and be given the same summative assessments as students taking the traditional course sections. Blended course instructors will be available to students every day that school is in session. A primary difference students will experience with Blended coursework is that frequent online engagement with course content will be required. Students taking a 'blended' section who do not have time release (including all 9th and 10th grades students), will be allowed to utilize the Pride Rock Commons, West-Theater Commons, Upper Commons-Library, Food Court, Study Commons at the Main Office, and South Commons, for required coursework as allowed by the instructor.

ISASP Results Expected in Early Fall

At this time, we expect ISASP (Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress) results to be released during the early fall. ISASP for this school year is scheduled to be given in early April of 2020.

Study Table RED Schedule

Study Table is a designated learning and learning assistance time (10:05-10:35 a.m.) scheduled once every two weeks throughout the school year. Study Table is a continuation of 1st Block/2nd Period. Those students who are requested by a teacher or who request to see a specific teacher will be issued a pass prior to Study Table. Only those students with passes are permitted to move rooms prior to Study Table.

Students staying in their 1st Block/2nd Period classes must be studying as a quiet study environment is maintained throughout the building.

ACADEMIC INFO

UNIFIED CLASSROOM NOW USED TO ACCESS POWERSCHOOL AND POWERSCHOOL LEARNING

The student information system, PowerSchool, and the student learning system, PowerSchool Learning, will now be accessed under one 'umbrella', called Unified Classroom, for students and parents to more efficiently access both platforms. In other words, students and parents will now go to Unified Classroom to access either PowerSchool or PowerSchool Learning. Parents with more than one student in school will still use only one passcode for each student.

The information viewed on PowerSchool is the same for both student and parent. Please feel free to contact the 9th-10th Grades Office, 11th-12th Grades Office, or Main Office for assistance with accessing. If you have questions regarding student academic scores in PowerSchool, please contact your student's teacher for clarification. If a question or issue remains following the teacher contact, please do not hesitate to contact the Main Office, 9th-10th Grades Office, or the 11th-12th Grades Office for assistance.

Both traditional course grading and student progress toward the specific standards are kept for all LMHS courses and are available on PowerSchool. For questions regarding finding this information, feel free to contact the 9th-10th Grades Office (447-3043), 11th-12th Grades Office (447-3070), Main Office (447-3040), or your student's counselor.

All LMHS courses will be using PowerSchool Learning for monitoring student progress toward all Priority Standards in a given course. Priority Standards are the 'must haves' for ALL students in each course. PowerSchool Learning will help provide multiple, differentiated online learning opportunities for students regarding the Priority and Supporting Standards for each course.

Teachers will be focusing on more than just Priority Standards in each course, and teachers may include these in PowerSchool Learning. Use of PSL as an instructional tool will continue to take time and development. All courses will be utilizing the tool and students will experience varying levels of options for each of the areas in PSL as teachers continue to enhance the use of PSL in their courses. The PSL 'icons' (see chart to right) are used to help students navigate specific learning needs while using PowerSchool Learning.

COLLEGE AND CAREER CENTER

LEARNING CENTER

STUDENT TUTORING REQUESTS

Tutoring takes place in forty-five minute sessions between 7:30 a.m. and 4:20 p.m. in The Learning Center, The Upper Commons/Library, or in the Main Office.

PEER TUTORS and ADULT TUTORS

Applications to be a Student Peer Tutor (either volunteer or for credit) may be picked up in the 9th -10th Grades Office, 11th-12th Grades Office, or online. A brief orientation meeting is required of all tutors prior to a tutoring assignment. See your counselor for questions.

EARLY GRADUATION REQUESTS

Any seniors planning to graduate at the end of 1st Semester are required by Board Policy to have a signed Early Graduation form to the Principal's Office by December 2, 2019. Students wishing to graduate at the end of 3rd Quarter must have a signed Early Graduation form to the Principal's Office by March 2, 2020. Students should see their school counselor for information regarding Early Graduation and the form required prior to School Board approval.

TIME RELEASE

Juniors and Seniors may be granted Time Release during unscheduled time if:

- 1. A parent permission form is on file in the 11th-12th Grades Office
- 2. All grades in the previous grading period were passing
- 3. In good standing with the Code of Conduct and Attendance Policy

Parents may revoke or reinstate Time Release (if eligible) at any time. Students with no Time Release are assigned to a specific seat in the Learning Center. Grades 9 and 10 do NOT have Time Release privileges and must report to The Learning Center or the assigned Sophomore Commons Release area for all unscheduled periods.

Time Release students are <u>NOT</u> permitted to move throughout the building without a pass during class time.

LUNCH MONEY

Lunch money may be deposited into accounts each day in the Cashier's Office any time from 7:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. For the deposit to be applied to the current day's lunch account, the deposit must be made by 10:15 a.m. Money may also be deposited online using a link on the district website.

STUDENT LOCKERS

All 9th Grade students are assigned lockers. 10th, 11th and 12th Grades students may request a locker through the grade levels offices. Student lockers are to store school materials and personal items needed for school. All students are advised NOT to bring valuable or non-school related items to school. Students are responsible for keeping assigned lockers clean.

ANNUAL HEARING SCREENING

Students new to Linn-Mar, and students with a known history of ear problems may be tested for hearing during the school year. Parents who do not want their student's hearing tested will need to indicate this in writing to the school nurse each year.

MEDICATION

Students who must take prescribed medication at school must have written authorization on file in the Health Office. Non-prescribed medication will be given with physician and parent approval only. Students are not to carry any medication at any time without a note of approval from the school nurse. Contact the Health Office at 447-3080 for questions.

BUILDING CLOSES AT 3:45 P.M. EACH DAY

This is a reminder that the Linn-Mar High School building officially closes each day at 3:45 p.m. Students with activities beginning after 3:45 p.m. must leave and return when the activity is scheduled. Parent Advisory Council

CrisisGo! for Parents and Safe2SpeakUP for Students available for mobile devices

LMHS students will have the opportunity to install Safe2SpeakUP on their mobile devices for the 2019-20 school year. Safe2SpeakUP provides two important features. First, any crisis information, including instructions for what they should do, will be received immediately by students with the app. Also, students will be able to contact administrators and counselors through this app to seek needed help or provide information should a crisis be taking place. Second, Safe2SpeakUP allows students to provide administrators and counselors information of a potential threat to themselves or others within the school. Information for how to download the Safe2SpeakUP app will be provided at the start of school. School-issued computers will also have an icon for student access on Safe2SpeakUP. This will only have the reporting feature at this time, not the alert feature that is on the Safe2SpeakUP app for student mobile devices.

Parents will also be able to install CrisisGo! on your mobile devices. Having this app will allow parents to 'view only' any crisis messages sent out through CrisisGo! to staff and students. Information for how to access and install the parent version of CrisisGo! for Linn-Mar High School will be emailed directly to parents at the beginning of the school year.

LMHS Fire, Tornado, Serious Threat Drills

LMHS will schedule four Fire drills, four Severe Weather/Tornado drills, and two Serious Threat/ Intruder Evacuation drills during the 2019-20 school year. Any unscheduled Fire or Tornado alarms that may occur during the year do not count as having a drill. All drills coordinate involvement of both the high school and LRC buildings. The high school and LRC buildings will be participating in a Serious Threat evacuation drill on September 10 at 10:10 a.m. Currently, 1st semester Fire drills are scheduled for August 29 and September 16. 1st semester Severe Weather/Tornado drills are scheduled for September 3 and September 20.

Standard-Based in 2020-21? What does this mean?

LMHS is working to base traditional letter grades on student progress and proficiency toward Priority and Supporting Standards beginning in the fall of 2020. More informational opportunities will be provided during the 2019-20 school year regarding this work. The purpose of mentioning this now is to provide a brief overview of what Standards-Based at LMHS will and will not look like.

Traditional letter grades will still be used in all courses. In 2020-21, the letter grades will be based entirely off of proficiency progress toward specific Priority and Supporting Standards in each course and no longer on a point system based on both academic and non-academic factors. Currently in PowerSchool, students are given both a percentage-scale score based on points and a proficiency-scale score based on standards. Student grades are currently based on the percentage-scale score. In 2020-21, proficiency-scale scores based on the standards will be converted to letter grades using an established conversion scale.

Student grade transcripts will not change. LMHS students will still have grade point averages and transcripts that show the letter grades and grade point averages as they do now.

The primary reasons for working toward this change of basing letter grades on proficiency-scale scores based on standards instead of percentage-scale scores based on points is to provide specificity in identifying and diagnosing learning need areas for each student, which then allows for more targeted interventions to take place. This includes both students who may be struggling to understand or perform the expectations of the standards and also those students who excel in understanding or performance of a particular standard. It also helps to ensure a focus on the 'must haves' (Priority Standards) for each course is being achieved by all students.
