### **Meal Account Balances**

*Meal account balances* will carry over next fall. Accounts will automatically roll to the building where your student will attend.

**If you are leaving the Linn-Mar District**, please request your meal account balance refund from Ruth Noth, Total Access Meal Account Coordinator. She can be reached by phone at 533-5559 or by email at <u>rnoth@linnmar.k12.ia.us</u>. You may also designate your refund be directed to a family who may have a difficult time paying for school meals.

#### Free and Reduced Meal Eligibility

If your family is eligible for free school meals based on **food stamp eligibility**, you do not have to complete a new application form next fall. If you qualify for free or reduced meals based on your **income**, we will need a new application completed in August. Forms will be mailed to households this summer. Please return your form on registration day. Sometimes families are surprised to see the upper limits of eligibility. Please take time to read through the information you receive. Reduced price meals are \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch. This can be a BIG savings for families. All meal choices are available to all students regardless of their status. Information regarding meal status is confidential and is not "identifiable" at the cashier station. Please contact the Nutrition Services office at 447-3302 if you have questions.

#### Grade Level News

<u>Kindergarten</u>: It is crazy to think about the school year being almost done! Your children have been working incredibly hard over the last few weeks. We have begun some of the final testing for the year and it is so incredible the amount of growth that these children have made through the year. To say that we are proud of these kids would be an understatement! Over the last month we have really dove into our animals 2X2 unit in science. We have had goldfish and guppies, water snails and land snails, red worms and earthworms and isopods (rolly polly bugs) visit our room. The children focused on observing them and learning the different body parts of each animal and a focus on their behaviors, such as how do they move and what do they like to do. We also have spent the last month with chicken eggs in our incubators. Each class was lucky to have 4 to 5 chicks hatch this year. Each class was able to watch at least one egg hatch live! Now we are observing our chicks and learning about their behaviors. In our PRIDE groups, we had a focus on writing. We focused on including adjectives into our writing. It was exciting to see how the kids took off with their writing. We incorporated a writing strategy called The *Genius* Ladder, which focuses on adding in details and adjectives into their writing by spicing them up and making it more interesting to read for the reader.

<u>First grade</u>: First graders are working really hard these last weeks of school! Our Journeys curriculum is wrapping up and we are testing to see how much we've learned! In Math, we are reviewing many concepts and skills as we work in our final unit and are preparing for the end-of-year testing. In science, we continue to learn about plants and animals and have developed quite the green thumbs during this unit! Please remember that our Thomas Park field trip is Thursday, May 4th. Students should wear comfortable clothing and shoes (no sandals or flip-flops). We will eat lunch at the park in the large pavilion at 11:00, and parents/families are welcome to join us for lunch at that time. Let's hope for great weather that day! As the school year begins to wind down, please remind your child to keep reading and working hard. It's been an amazing year in first grade. We are thankful for all the great families we got to work with this year.

<u>Second grade</u>: Wow, this year has flown by! The kiddos are getting ready to become 3<sup>rd</sup> graders! We have begun working on multiplication and division in math. The students are using arrays and math facts to solve their problems. These are things you can practice each night at home to make them more automatic. Science is winding down now that we have received and studied all of our critters. We have habitats for mealworms (now beetles), milkweed beetles, silkworms (soon to be moths), and painted lady caterpillars. We are hoping to see the final life cycle stages before the end of the year. Junior achievement has also come to an end. It went along well with our final unit for social studies. The students got hands-on learning about goods, services, voting, taxes, and money in the community. Thank you for everything you do to help support your students outside of school!



Third grade: April showers... have brought May PLANTS! We are well into our Structures of Life unit in science. This unit begins with the study of seeds and germination. Just like the kids, our seeds are growing like weeds. We will continue to watch them flourish while learning more about their life cycle. This unit has also brought some visitors to 3<sup>rd</sup> grade... CRAYFISH! The crayfish are teaching us about their physical structures, habitats, behavior, and territory. We will conclude this unit with the study of bones. On May 9th, we will be visiting the Indian Creek Nature Center so that we can learn more about animals, adaptations, and habitats. In math, we have been learning about double digit multiplication by way of lattice method and partial products! In literacy, our Journey's curriculum has switched gears to fiction and non-fiction magazine articles. We are also reading chapter books together in small groups. This allows us to dig deeper into the study of characters, plot, setting, and more! In writing, we have wrapped up our fictional narratives. Our students have had a great time using their imagination to create a fictional story that includes a problem and solution. As the school year begins to wind down, please remind your child to keep reading and working hard. It's been a phenomenal year in third grade. We are thankful for such great families to work with all year long.

<u>Fourth grade</u>: Wow!! Where has the year gone? It's hard to believe that we are already winding down and that soon your child with be a 5th grader! We have had the privilege of hearing the band and orchestra this month and instrument tryouts. Don't forget to attend the Band/Orchestra meeting if your child wants to participate in one of them. As the year winds down we still have a lot to do. We are wrapping math with Units 11-12 in math focusing on geometric solids and volume. In Social Studies we are working on our state projects. We will have our Celebration of the States on May 23 at 2:00, we hope you will be able to join us. We will be attending Careers on Wheels on May 12 at St. Mark's Church, this is an opportunity for students to learn about careers based out of vehicles. Please remember to continue to read and return weekly Reading Logs.

Fifth grade: May is an exciting time for our fifth graders. They will participate in Track Day on May 4. All students will do both running and field events. Barry Grove will be here on May 10 to do a special presentation about the colonial times. He takes on the character of a colonial person and also shares special artifacts from that time period; it's a great way to bring our social studies curriculum to life. On May 16, fifth graders will dissect a pig's heart as part of our Living Systems science curriculum. If you are interested in volunteering, please contact your child's teacher. Fifth graders will spend May 17 at Camp Wapsie. Students will participate in canoeing, team building, archery, etc. On May 19, fifth graders will be touring Excelsior as part of our transition to the middle school. In addition to all the fun things we have planned, will we move forward with academics as we finish our fifth grade curriculum. We will miss our fifth graders but are excited for them as they get to experience new opportunities in middle school.



### Notes from the Music Room May 2017

The school year is beginning to wind down. The Chorus had a gorgeous day for their field trip on April 14. They sang some songs of appreciation at the Volunteer Appreciation held in the Multi Purpose Room. Then they sang for an enthusiastic group at Linn-Mar High School. When we were done singing, two the choirs sang for us. They next went to Summit Pointe and sang and visited with the residents there.

Our home concert was held on April 18. I am so proud of the GREAT job our singers have done this year!!!!
