## **Staff Learning**

On October 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, while your children were not in school, teachers were learning from national experts on Professional Learning Communities. This allowed Novak teachers to collaborate with teachers across the district. We are improving our teaching practices in order to raise student achievement.

#### **FAST**

FAST is a State required reading assessment given to students in our Early Childhood Blended Program, kindergarten, and first through fifth grade. As a building, we have raised our beginning of the year proficiency score up 6% from last year. We are starting the year with 70% of our students proficient on this assessment. Any student not meeting the State benchmark is receiving extra support in reading. Students at proficiency are receiving enrichment in reading or math.

#### **Red Cross Donations**

Last month we collected change to donate to the Red Cross for the victims of recent hurricanes. As a result of this, we collected \$269.64 that has been donated. Thanks to everyone that was able to contribute.

# ALICE: Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate

#### "Parade of Bands" Concert:

On Tuesday, November 14<sup>th</sup>, the bands from Novak, Indian Creek, Linn Grove and Wilkins (Eastside) will have their first concert. The program will be held in the Linn-Mar High School Auditorium and begins at 7:45 pm. The concert will include performances by the Eastside 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Band, the Excelsior 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Band the Linn-Mar High School Wind Symphony. The concert should last about one hour.

We ask that students arrive at school between 7:10-7:30 pm (but not before 7:00 pm). All band students should report to the High School Little Theatre for instructions before proceeding to the stage. *Please* have the students wear nice dress clothes for this major performance. A free will donation can be made at the door.

In preparation for the concert, we will be practicing together the morning of Tuesday, November 14<sup>th</sup> at Linn-Mar High School. Please drop your student off at the north side of the High School (stadium side) at **Door 3 between 6:45 and 6:50 am for our 7:00-7:45 am morning rehearsal.** It is very important that your student attend this rehearsal. Students will be bused to school after the rehearsal. Percussion, baritone and tuba instruments will already be at the high school. All other students should bring their instruments and band music.

<u>Winter Weather Note</u>: With winter approaching, please remember that if there is a weather-related **LATE START**, group band **WILL NOT** meet – but students should still bring their instruments to school for lessons.



## **PBIS News**

# **Novak Physical Education**

It's been a very busy first months of school. We enjoyed our time with student teacher, Mr. Smith. During his time here, Mr. Smith Developed and taught a soccer unit to all grade levels. Skill focus was on dribbling, passing, shooting, as well as some basic offensive and defensive strategies. The weather this fall has been very helpful and students in third through fifth grade had the opportunity to utilize our soccer fields throughout the unit. Grades K-2 also reviewed a variety of locomotor skills. These included walk, run, jump, hop, gallop, side-slide, and skip.

### **October**

This month, students in **fourth and fifth** grades are completing their fall Fitness-gram testing. Once all the date is entered, you will receive an email with a printout of their scores as well as information on whether or not they are in the healthy fitness zone. Ideas will also be presented on ways in which to improve any areas that are no currently within the healthy fitness zone. This is all done within the Fitness-gram software.

Novak Physical Education (cont'd)

**Third grade** just completed a fitness unit in which time was spent practicing the Fitness-gram tests for next year as well as learning how to find and measure their pulse. We also participated in different fitness activities and discussed how they met the five Health-Related Fitness Components (Cardiovascular Endurance, Muscular Endurance, Muscular Strength, Flexibility, and Body Composition).

**Kindergarten through 2**<sup>nd</sup> **grade** tried out some different equipment during stations including jump ropes, hoppity balls and scoops. We've also begun our throwing unit. Students should be able to explain and demonstrate and underhand throw. I use the cues (tic-toc for the arm motion, step with the opposite foot, throw). We are just beginning to practice an overhand throw (Mr. T, Muscle, Step, throw, follow through).

## **Looking Ahead**

Spooky Stations – look for fun photos and videos on Seesaw.

Throwing – Upper grade levels will focus primarily on the overhand throw.
