The School Year Begins on Tuesday, August 23 at 8:30 a.m.

The 2016-17 school year begins on Tuesday, August 23. Early-Bird Marching Band will begin at 7:15 a.m. Student IDs and 1st Quarter Schedules will be distributed from 7:45-8:25 a.m. A Regular Schedule will be used on this day with 1st Period/1st Block beginning at 8:30 a.m. Period 8/Block 4 ends at 3:30 p.m.

Students riding the bus to school will be dropped off on the north side of the building and enter at Door #3. Students will also board buses at this location after school. Buses will depart from the school on a Regular Schedule day at 3:40 p.m.

9TH GRADE ORIENTATION IS THURSDAY, AUGUST 18 AT 6:00 P.M.

All incoming 9th graders and parents are encouraged to attend orientation on Thursday, August 18, beginning at 6:00 p.m. <u>Students should enter Door #13 (south entrance on south side of building) anytime</u> after 5:30. Parents should report to the Auditorium at 6:00 using Door #1 or #3 (north side of the building).

Students will be involved in sessions to become familiar with the daily schedule, the building, lunch, student handbook, student activities and other procedures in an effort to be as prepared as possible for the 9th grade year. In addition, there will be a speaker, pizza, and an activity fair. The student orientation will run from 6:00 –9:30 p.m. Parents should plan to pick up students at 9:30 p.m. in the South Lot.

ACADEMIC LETTER ASSEMBLIES ON SEPTEMBER 1

Three Academic Assemblies will be held on Thursday, <u>September 1</u>. The 10th Grade assembly honoring Sophomore academic letter winners will begin at <u>9:00 a.m.</u> The 11th Grade assembly will begin at <u>2:00 p.m.</u> and the 12th Grade assembly will begin at <u>10:30 a.m.</u> Each ceremony will take approximately thirty minutes followed by pictures. All three assemblies occur in the LMHS Auditorium. Students in grades 10-12, who had a cumulative grade point average of 3.33 during the 2015-16 school year, will receive academic letters.

<u>LMHS Main Building Door</u> <u>Entry Protocol for 2016-17</u>

All LMHS students and visitors will enter the Main building through **Door #3 (North Entrance)** or **Door #13 (South Entrance)**. Door #1 will no longer be used by students and visitors as an entrance to LMHS during the school day.

<u>At NO TIME is anyone to open any outside</u> <u>door for anyone without</u> <u>administrative authorization</u>.

LMHS Student Entry/Exit for Classes at the LRC for 2016-17

Nine LRC classrooms will again be used by LMHS for the 2016-17 school year. All LMHS students taking classes at the LRC will enter and exit this building from the LRC West/10th Street entrance. Students taking classes at the LRC will use Door #13 (South Entrance) when returning to LMHS.

HOME OF THE LIONS

Office Location Changes

Only the Main Office will remain in the current location this school year. The completion of renovated areas relocates all other offices within the building. The 9th-10th Grades Office will be at the North entrance of the building. The 11th-12th Grades Office will be at the South entrance of the building. The Athletic Office will be located at door #10, the Main Gym entrance. The Nurse's Office will move to a portion of the former 9th-10th Grades Office. Our three Student Assistance Counselors will move to another portion of the former 9th-10th Grades Office. The Cashier's Office will be located in the 11th-12th Grades Office with the access window in the South Commons.

<u>New 'Commons' Learning Spaces at LMHS</u>

LMHS will have seven 'Commons' learning spaces for students beginning in 2016-17. Each of these spaces will have varied learning and media resources for students. LMHS will now have the infrastructure in place to better meet the needs of 21st Century Learners in collaborative, resourceful, purposeful, and engaging learning environments for online and college coursework, as well as for 'blended' learning opportunities. Each location is an academic environment, and students are expected to use each of these areas in this manner. The 'Commons' learning space locations are:

The Pride Rock Commons The West/Theater Commons The South Commons The Main Office/Study Commons The Upper Commons/Library The Commons at the Four Corners The Outdoor Commons and Vestibule

The Lower Commons/Cafeteria and Food Court are also 'Commons' learning spaces with lunch served during Block 3/Periods 5-6.

COLLEGE AND CAREER CENTER

The College and Career Center is now housed in its new, permanent location adjacent to the South Commons. It is staffed by school counselors and the records secretary before and during the school day. Visiting colleges and career speakers will be available in the center, as well as planning resources and information. Several planned informational meetings will be available to students and parents during the year.

On September 13, a College Planning Night will be held at 6:00 p.m., and a Financial Aid Night will be held at 7:00 p.m. Both of these meetings will be held in the College and Career Center and South Commons. Building entry for these two meetings will be through Door #10.

FAMILY CONNECTION AVAILABLE FOR LMHS STUDENTS AND PARENTS

Linn-Mar High School has partnered with Naviance to provide a variety of tools for student achievement through academic planning. These tools are located in **Family Connection**, a website for students and families to access online resources, communicate with school counselors, and collaborate on college and career readiness activities. Students can research colleges, scholarships, careers, enrichment programs and courses in one location. They can also create individual plans that can be linked to college and career readiness. Students can communicate easily with counselors through Family Connection.

For college and career readiness, students can request transcripts and recommendations for college applications, as well as complete career assessments and perform college and career searches. Students can also create goals and track associated tasks and activities.

Students can access Family Connection on the LMHS web page using their network username and password. Parents are issued a separate registration code in order to access Family Connection.

<u>STUDENT TUTORING REQUESTS</u>

Request forms for receiving a student peer or adult tutor may be found in the 9th-10th Grades Office, the 11th-12th Grades Office, or online. As many requests as possible are matched with a tutor. Tutoring takes place in forty-five minute sessions between 7:30 a.m. and 4:20 p.m. in The Learning Center The Upper Commons/Library, or in the Main Office.

PEER TUTORS and ADULT TUTORS

Applications to be a Student Peer Tutor (either volunteer or for credit) may be picked up in the 9th-10th Grades Office, 11th-12th Grades Office, or online. A brief orientation meeting is required of all tutors prior to a tutoring assignment. See your counselor for questions.

Linn-Mar Parking Plan for 2016-17

A change in campus parking for students during the 2015-16 school year was made to ensure safety in the parking lots during the school day. The primary measure taken to ensure safety was to decrease the expectation of finding a parking space on campus by limiting the number of parking tags issued to the number of parking spaces available. A lottery was held to determine parking tag eligibility for designated parking lots. The parking lots were given grade-level designations of 11th-12th Grades and 9th-10th Grades. A fee of \$25.00 for each tag was made to serve as a guarantee for a campus parking space and to help in the supervision and surveillance of the lots both during and outside of the school day. During the year, the number of parking tags issued was increased as not all lot spaces were filled on a particular day. By the end of the 3rd week of school, all 11th and 12th grades students requesting a parking tag were issued a tag. For the 2016-17 school year, the concept of limiting the number of issued parking tags will remain with the \$25.00 tag fee guaranteeing an on-campus parking space for students with parking tags. Feedback was received in many forms, including through all four Student Advisory Councils, Parent Advisory, and the Building Management Team (BMT) comprised of faculty representatives from every department in the high school. A draft of the 2016-17 parking plan was developed using this feedback, and input was sought, again, from all four grade-level Student Advisory Councils, Parent Advisory, and BMT. The 2016-17 LMHS Parking Plan is the result of this feedback. Guiding ideas in plan development from feedback and circumstance: LMHS will have two main building entrances in 2016-17: North and South (*circumstance*). Direct access to the building from the North lot will exist at Door #3. Door #3 (North) and Door #13 (South) will be the only entrances during the school day. Work to have as many as possible, if not all, 11th and 12th grade students who request parking tags receive a parking tag. (feedback) Allow for 11th - 12th grades students to state a North, Far North or South Lot preference.(*feedback*) 10th grade has significantly more drivers than 9th grade, thus, should have priority over 9th grade. (9th grade had about 25 students with authorized school driver permits when the 2015-16 school year started). (feedback) Previous issues regarding the parking lots have been minimized if not eliminated by limiting the number of parking tags issued. (*feedback*) Centralize location of parking information, including results of the parking lottery. (*feedback*) Make parking lot maps easier to read. (*feedback*) The Parking Plan: (w/the approval of Student Advisory Councils for grades 12, 11, 10 and 9.) 11th and 12th Grades: (approximately 700 parking tags) Lottery will determine choice of three designated parking lots (North, Far North, South). Lottery sign up begins from late May through Friday, August 12. Students will make lot preferences on sign up form prior to the Lottery. Three lots (North, Far North, South) should allow for all 11th and 12th grade students who are eligible for a parking tag to have one. Lottery takes place on Monday, August 15. Lottery selectees may begin purchasing parking tags on Monday, August 15. \$25.00 for parking tag. Students must present a valid driver license at the time of submitting application for the lottery. 10th Grade: (approximately 225 parking tags) Lottery will determine eligibility for parking tag. Lottery sign up begins in late May through Friday, August 12. Lottery takes place on Monday, August 15. Lottery selectees may begin purchasing parking tags on Monday, August 15. \$25.00 for parking tag. Stadium East/Aquatic Center Lot, East Lot will be 10th grade parking areas. Completion of renovation will open spaces in the East Lot during year. (Will issue tags for the Far North, North or South Lots during year as space allows). Students must present a valid driver license at the time of submitting application for the lottery. 9th Grade: (approximate space for 25 vehicles) Armstrong Field Gravel Lot area (tag required, no fee). Staff: (approximately 225 parking spaces) Assigned in a designated staff parking area. Designated staff parking areas of North Lot, South Lot, West Lot and East Lot. Visitors: (approximately 40 parking spaces) Designated 'Visitor' parking areas in the North Lot and South Lot. *Parking Lottery results will be posted on the LMHS Webpage as well as in the 9th-10th Grades Office and the 11th-12th Grades Office on the afternoon of August 15.

TIME RELEASE

Juniors and Seniors may be granted Time Release during unscheduled time if:

- 1. A parent permission form is on file in the 11th-12th Grades Office
 - 2. All grades in the previous grading period were passing
 - 3. In good standing with the Code of Conduct and Attendance Policy

Parents may revoke or reinstate Time Release (if eligible) at any time. Students with no Time Release are assigned to a specific seat in the Media Center. Grades 9 and 10 do NOT have Time Release privileges and must report to The Learning Center for all unscheduled periods.

11th and 12th grade students with Time Release, who are receiving a failing grade after the sixth week of a quarter, will have Time Release revoked for the remaining three weeks of the quarter. This is to provide supervised academic study time and academic support, and should help students to successfully complete the course(s).

ONLY FOUR HOMEROOM SESSIONS IN 2016-17

Four Homeroom sessions will be held during the 2016-17 school year. The purpose of Homeroom is to help dispense important information as well as develop another connection to LMHS. Students stay with the same Homeroom and teacher during their time at LMHS.

The Homeroom dates are August 25, October 27, January 26, and April 6. Topics will include: Student Handbook 'points of emphasis', Harassment Procedures, Healthy Kids Act, 9th Grade Adjustment Sessions, Course Registration Planning, Graduation Planning, Post-Secondary Planning, Job Shadowing and Internship Planning, and information distribution. A separate Homeroom Schedule will be used on these four dates

Homeroom is required of all students, and attendance will be taken at each session.

ANNUAL HEARING SCREENING
