PSAT INFORMATION FOR JUNIORS

The PSAT National Merit Scholarship Competition exam will be given on Wednesday, October 19. Every year, National Merit Scholarships are available for students based on performance on the PSAT. The assessment serves as both a practice for students planning to take the SAT, as well as the qualifier for the prestigious National Merit Scholarships. Cost for the exam is \$15, and can be paid in the Cashier's Office. Sign-up is in the 11th/12th Grade Office. RENOVATION UPDATE

A major portion of the LMHS renovation project is close to completion with the remainder of the project scheduled to be done this January. Currently, fourteen classrooms, four auxiliary rooms, and two sets of restrooms are being renovated on both floors of the south side of the building. These classrooms are being completed in three six week phases with the first phase completed in September, and the second phase to be completed in early November with phase three completion at the end of December. Renovation of two Business Education classrooms has also been completed for use in late September.

One classroom is also being renovated near door #16 beside the area being developed into the Presentation/Lecture Hall. When completed, the Presentation/Lecture Hall will have approximately 125 permanent seats with additional floor seating available for a room capacity of about 150. The area to the north of the Presentation/Lecture Hall is being renovated for the district Print Shop/Copy Center. The renovated classroom, Presentation/Lecture Hall, and district Print Shop/Copy Center, are scheduled for completion in late December.

The former weight room is currently being renovated into three classrooms and one set of restrooms. The classrooms are scheduled for completion at the end of first quarter, while the restrooms are scheduled for completion in mid-November. The flooring, ceiling/lighting, and stairway will also be completed during school breaks in November and December.

The former location of the 9th-10th Grades Office is being renovated as the new Health/Nurse's Office. Completion of this center is scheduled for late October. Another portion of this area is already being used as the new location for the Student Assistance Counselors Office. The staff room will be moved into the area currently serving as our Health/Nurse's Office.

The stair into the Lower Commons/Cafeteria area is scheduled for renovation during Winter break. Other items, such as bench seating throughout the building, signage, and a lot of touchup will continue to take place through the end of the project.

STUDENT TUTORING REQUESTS

Request forms for receiving a student peer or adult tutor may be found in the 9th-10th Grades Office, the 11th-12th Grades Office, or online. As many requests as possible are matched with a tutor. Tutoring takes place in forty-five minute sessions between 7:30 a.m. and 4:20 p.m. in The Learning Center The Upper Commons/Library, or in the Main Office.

EMERGENCY DRILLS AND PREPARATION

Two fire drills and two tornado/severe weather event drills were held during the first two weeks of school. Fire drills were held on August 24 (10:15 a.m.) and August 30 (2:00 p.m.). Exit from the building averaged just over two minutes, while roll was taken at the evacuation locations within five minutes. We have also had four renovation related unplanned fire alarms during August-September.

Tornado/severe weather event drills were held on August 25 (2:00 p.m.) and August 29 (10:15 a.m.). The average time to get everyone into shelter areas was three and a half minutes. Two tornado/severe weather event drills and two fire alarms will also be held during 2nd Semester.

Students were also provided information and direction on September 2 (9:50 a.m.) regarding an Immediate Threat/Intruder/Lockdown. Students were instructed that should they ever be told that there is a serious threat or intruder in the building that they are to flee to the nearest exit and go to either the ESCO Electric Building (using Barrington Blvd.) or the Indian Creek Country Club (on Indian Creek Road). Staff also discussed with students what to do to protect themselves if they cannot flee the building because the threat prevents them from doing so. Students were also informed that only law enforcement would be entering the building should a lockdown take place because of something happening either outside of the building on campus or in close proximity to the campus. The district will also have two informational ALICE (Alert-Lockdown-Inform-Counter-Evacuate) sessions during 2nd Semester. These sessions will be informational only, and students will not be actively participating in simulations.

Our goal is to ensure that all 2300 (students, staff, visitors) people in LMHS are safe at all times. Providing information and performing 'drills' as required and necessary are part of the process for ensuring the safety of all within the building at all times. The LRC classes and Aquatic Center classes also participate in all safety drills during the school year.

COLLEGE AND CAREER CENTER

The College and Career Center is now housed in its new, permanent location adjacent to the South Commons. It is staffed by school counselors and the records secretary before and during the school day. Visiting colleges and career speakers will be available in the center, as well as planning resources and information. Informational meetings will be available to students and parents during the year.

HOMEROOM SESSIONS ON THURSDAY, OCTOBER 27

One Homeroom session is scheduled for Thursday, October 27, at 10:00 a.m.

- Seniors will have a class meeting in the Auditorium.
- Juniors will be taking the Iowa Youth Survey.
- Sophomores will have a class meeting in the Main Gym with a presentation from Josten's.
- Freshmen will be in Homeroom classrooms having a High School Adjustment session with the topic of adjusting to high school and group building.

Homeroom is required of all students, and attendance will be taken at each session.

TIME RELEASE

Juniors and Seniors may be granted Time Release during unscheduled time if:

- 1. A parent permission form is on file in the 11th-12th Grades Office
- 2. All grades in the previous grading period were passing
- 3. In good standing with the Code of Conduct and Attendance Policy

Parents may revoke or reinstate Time Release (if eligible) at any time. Students with no Time Release are assigned to a specific seat in the Media Center. Grades 9 and 10 do NOT have Time Release privileges and must report to The Learning Center for all unscheduled periods.

11th and 12th grade students with Time Release, who are receiving a failing grade after the sixth week of a quarter, will have Time Release revoked for the remaining three weeks of the quarter. This is to provide supervised academic study time and academic support, and should help students to successfully complete the course(s).
