Thank you for the support you have provided as we launched into a new year. It made such a difference. It was a pure joy to have our students back and to meet our kindergarteners and students joining Bowman Woods this year.

On September 12, eligible voters in the Linn-Mar Community School District will be asked to consider an \$80 million bond package that will support a grade-restructuring plan. This plan will enable the district to construct two new 5-6 intermediate schools, a future elementary school and provide much-needed renovations to our three historic elementary schools (Bowman Woods, Indian Creek and Wilkins Elementary) in addition to Excelsior Middle School.

This restructuring plan strategically addresses existing and long-term capacity, safety, security, and efficiency issues in our rapidly growing district. Implementation of the plan requires a successful bond vote.

With the addition of the 5-6 intermediate schools, Linn-Mar's elementary schools would become PK or K-4<sup>th</sup> grade and the middle schools would house grades 7-8.

By building the two intermediate schools and moving our 5<sup>th</sup> graders into those schools, we are able to free up class space throughout our elementary and middle schools. For our school, the plan would also provide us with much-needed renovations.

In the past five years alone, student population in the district has grown by 15 percent, yet our mission remains unchanged... to provide the best possible education for our students in a safe and secure environment.

### The Bowman Woods Library Mission

The mission of the Bowman Woods library program is to provide an inviting, learning environment that assists staff and students with integrating effective informational resources and technology in the classroom, developing lifelong learning skills, and fostering reading for joy.

### Library Information

Library checkout takes place during your child's library class time, once every eight days, for grades 3-5 and once every 4 days for grades K-2. Materials are checked out for 10 days and can be renewed if a hold is not placed on it and it is brought to the library. Kindergarteners check out three materials, first graders check out five materials and the remainder of the grades are unlimited. If there is an outstanding fee or late material, the student is not allowed to check out until the fee is paid or the material is returned. Occasionally, we send out notices or emails with overdue information in hopes that the books can be found and returned.

#### AMERICA READS: Reading is Contagious

The AMERICA READS: *Reading is Contagious* event is designed to shine a spotlight on the importance of reading to young children to improve literacy and demonstrate the joy of reading through collective citizen involvement. In the Cedar Rapids metro area, it has become an annual fall tradition, bringing hundreds of volunteers into area schools to share a favorite book with students. AMERICA READS: *Reading Is Contagious* 2017 will be held Oct. 19-20. Bowman Woods Elementary will have the even on Thursday, October 19<sup>th</sup>.

Developed and launched in 1997, the initiative is a collaborative effort between the Cedar Rapids Community, College Community, Linn-Mar, Marion Independent, and Xavier Catholic school districts, as well Summit School and the five public libraries: Cedar Rapids, Ely, Fairfax, Hiawatha, and Marion. Local businesses and organizations provide financial support.

More than 2,500 guest readers visited elementary schools over the two-day period in October 2015. Some 16,000 students benefited from exposure to the enthusiastic readers. Volunteer readers include everyone from parents and middle, high school and college students to school neighbors, senior citizens, business people and local "celebrities". The community readers share their love of reading by doing just that—each volunteer read a favorite story to a child, a small group of children or to an entire classroom of students.

Numerous studies indicate that children who have been read to on a regular basis are the ones who become good readers. Reading just 30 minutes a day with a child can significantly increase a child's reading ability. By sharing a story, AMERICA READS volunteers also celebrate their own love of reading with students. That special book might just become someone else's favorite! After all, reading is contagious!"
