If severe weather, including fog, forces a late arrival, early dismissal, or cancellation of school for the entire day, announcements will be made on:


- District website banner www.linnmar.k12.ia.us

Unless you see an announcement, assume school is running as usual.

If we have late arrival: - Watch for our sign out front!

- School will start at 10:30a.m.
- All before school activities are cancelled

If we have an early dismissal:



- The school does **not** have the means to call parents to notify them that school is dismissing early, but we will send an all-school email if we have timely notice.
- Please make sure that the school knows where your child should go in case of an early dismissal. It's important that your child also knows where he or she needs to go. Thank you for your help with this.
- All after school activities at Bowman are cancelled.

Before/After School Care will open at regular time and will begin immediately after school dismisses if any of the above occurs.

Winter Weather Dress

Snowy Weather and the Playground If there is snow on the ground, these are the guidelines we will be using at Bowman Woods for the playground:

- 1. Children without snow boots (boots that are not worn all day long) will be asked to play on the shoveled areas of the playground only.
- 2. Children with snow boots will be allowed to walk in the snowy areas.
- 3. Children with snow boots, snow pants/snow suits, and mittens/gloves will be allowed to play in the snow.

It is also a good idea to send hat/hood, ear band or earmuffs, and mittens/gloves as well. Since we all know the weather in Iowa changes quickly, it would be helpful if you could send these things with your child daily (a plastic grocery bag would be a great carryall bag). This way we all are sure to enjoy the snowy days on the playground without becoming wet and cold. Please label each item with your child's name. Our health office is no longer loaning winter wear for students to use at recess. Thanks so much for your help!!!!



Indoor/Outdoor Recess

In the event of rain, or when the temperature reaches below zero, students will have indoor recess. The office staff will monitor the temperature according to KCRG TV 9.

DATE to REMEMBER: This year's Winter Barnes and Noble Bowman Woods Book Fair is all day Friday, December 1. Just remember to say "I support Bowman Woods" if you make a purchase at the café or counter, so they can credit our school. The orchestras from Novak, Wilkins, Linn Grove and Indian Creek will combine and play at 5:00. The Bowman Woods Early Bird Chorus will be singing at 5:45 and the Bowman Woods Orchestra will play at 6:15. This is also the National Polar Express Reading Night at all Barnes and Noble stores, so come and enjoy the reading of Polar Express at 7pm. When at the checkout or café, just mention that you are "Supporting Bowman Woods" to have proceeds go towards our school library. The percentage earned from this evening at Barnes and Noble is spent on new books for the library.

The week of December 4-10 is Hour of Code week, but we can code anytime! Grades K-5 will be exploring coding using websites such as code.org, Scratch, Tynker and various iPad apps such as Daisy the Dino, Kode Carts, Fix the Factory, Boogie Bot, Codable Crafts, Kodables, Lightbot, HopScotch and Tynker.

Why code in elementary? Here are just three reasons.

- 1. Kids love it AND get it!
- 2. It contains fundamentals of computer science, which once these students reach working age, will be an area of great need.
- 3. Coding promotes critical thinking, problem solving, math, and stamina!

K-1 have been working on the basics of logging onto their computers, using the mouse, and finding websites on our Bowman Woods Symbaloo to explore. Soon the classes will be introduced to STEM rotations and the 4 C's: communication, collaboration, critical thinking and creativity.

2nd grade Took a short break from Typing.com to use Lightbox books which have a code on the inside page, which allow students to access more information about the non-fiction topic online.

3rd and 4th grade students are learning about digital citizenship through games on a website called Digital Passport. Some of the themes are multitasking with technology, knowing what is safe to share online, making good choices when using technology, and identifying cyberbullying.

3-5 have been exploring the free app EPIC, which brings a library to the child! Your child can use the app at home using the class code EKS-4308 and the secret word is "reading".
