ATTENDANCE/LUNCH PROCEDURE

- 3. Reason for absence/late arrival. If the absence is due to an illness, please include symptoms your child is experiencing or any diagnosis the doctor has informed you of. If they will be arriving late, please include whether they want main or alternate for their lunch choice.
- 4. Leave your name and phone number we can reach you at if we would have questions.

When your student arrives late or leaves early, parents/guardians must stop in at the office to sign them in/out.

Your student's teacher appreciates a note or phone call ahead of time if your child will be leaving early. We will call your student to the office when you arrive and not before. Please plan accordingly.




October is always a great month in the library since students are back in the groove and familiar with where they can find the books they enjoy. The whole school celebrates literacy on America Reads day with guest readers on Thursday, October 25. It is so fun to have so many volunteers showing up with picture books in hand! Don't worry, you can always borrow a book to share, too!

Library Policies

Preschoolers are allowed to check out 1 book at a time, Kindergarteners can checkout 3 materials at a time, 1^{st} graders can check out up to 5 materials at a time, and $2^{nd}-5^{th}$ have unlimited check out which means they many check out as many materials as they can take care of.

Materials are checked out for 10 days and can be renewed if the book is brought to the library. If a materials is overdue, the student may not checkout until that materials is returned or, if lost, paid for. If a material becomes lost and then is paid for, but then found; it may be returned to the library for a refund that would be put into your student's lunch account. Overdue reminders are sent to classroom teachers daily and emailed to parents periodically. Paper reminders are given to students occasionally as well.

FAQs...

- Why do we need to record hours? It's important for several reasons. It helps our school district, our school, and our students. Often these numbers are used when trying to quantify parent/community support for grant applications. THANKS TO ALL OF YOU WHO ARE DOING THIS! YOU'VE CAUGHT THE VISION!
- How do I record my hours? Go to this link: <u>http://volunteers.linnmar.k12.ia.us/login.asp</u>
- What if I don't remember my username and password, or what if I have never received a username/password? Go to the link previously mentioned, and click on the "forgot password or user name" button. Give the same email that you gave when you signed up to be a volunteer. If you're still not sure, you can email Nicole Krieger @ nicole.krieger@linnmar.k12.ia.us
- What if it's been more than 2 weeks since my volunteering happened? You can email us or Nicole about those items as well! Of course we do advocate getting those hours recorded asap; however, Nicole is very responsive about helping you record your time if more than 2 weeks have lapsed.
- How do I know if I am an "active" volunteer? You can always check with us if you're not sure. Active volunteers receive our regular emails and find out what volunteer opportunities are available. If you haven't received any email from us but used to be active from, you may just need to fill out the quick yearly volunteer disclosure again. It's available in the office and needs to be filled out yearly.
- How do I become an "active" volunteer if I've never volunteered at Linn-Mar before? Fill out the volunteer application, turn it in, attend a one-time orientation or interview and you'll be good to go! We would love to have you! There are always opportunities available!
- How do I get one of those cool Linn-Mar lanyards with my name on it? Linn-Mar likes to specially recognize volunteers that have recorded 100 or more volunteer hours by giving them a Linn-Mar lanyard with their name printed on it. You need to have recorded 100 hours of volunteer time within the district by May. It resets each year, so the hours do not continue to add upon past years. Volunteers that have given 100 or more hours are also treated to a special luncheon at the end of the year. Linn-Mar loves their volunteers!
