Dear Indian Creek Families,

This is such an exciting time of the year in elementary schools. The students seem to soar and we see lots of academic growth in these winter months!

We hope everyone is staying as healthy as possible. Please remind your children of good hand-washing habits as one way to remain healthy and ready to learn.

We are proud to continue and deepen our use of an additional academic communication tool here at our school. Teachers are using SeeSaw to showcase student learning at Indian Creek. Seesaw is a student-driven digital portfolio which allows parents to communicate with their student about the learning process. Seesaw gives families an immediate and personalized window into their child's school day, helping to answer that question "What did you do at school today?" One goal that we have here at Indian Creek with the use of SeeSaw is to mold students that are visible learners. Students that can speak about their learning journey, who know how they learn best and students who own their learning. This tool gives us opportunities to develop visible learners at our school.

The month of February brings a few special events to keep us all excited! Black History Month is an annual celebration of achievements by black Americans and a time for recognizing the central role of African Americans in U.S. history. Since 1976, every U.S. president has officially designated the month of February as Black History Month. Other countries around the world, including Canada and the United Kingdom, also devote a month to celebrating black history. In the United States, we also celebrate Presidents' Day on the third Monday of February. Presidents' Day is a United States holiday popularly honoring George Washington's February 22nd birthday and Abraham Lincoln's February 12th, birthday, and sometimes all of the U.S. presidents are recognized.

Please note on your calendar that Monday, February 18th is a No School Day. Our PTO will meet on Monday, February 11th at 6:30 PM in our school library. Lastly, students will enjoy a Valentine Exchange on Wednesday, February 14th. Letters may be mailed to Nathan Wear, Assistant Superintendent, 2999 North Tenth Street, Marion, IA 52302. Requests will be evaluated after an assessment of classroom seat space is made. Requests are **NOT** guaranteed from year to year. Interested parents should be aware that district transportation is **NOT** available to students receiving approval for an attendance center request.

CogAT Testing for 5th Grade Students

Parents/Guardians of 5th Grade Students:

Each year, the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) is given to all 5th graders in the district. The CogAT is a standardized test, but quite different from NWEA, Fastbridge Assessments, and Iowa Statewide Assessments of Student Progress. The CogAT measures students' learned reasoning and problem-solving abilities in the three areas most linked to success in school--Verbal, Quantitative, and Non-Verbal Reasoning. The CogAT measures the cognitive processes that a child has developed to learn new things and solve problems. Experiences both in and out of school affect this skill development.

The CogAT consists of three separate tests: Verbal, Non-Verbal, and Quantitative subtests. The test battery will be administered over three days during the week of February 19-22 for 45-50 minutes each day. The results of this test, in combination with NWEA, are used in the identification process for the Middle School Talented and Gifted (TAG) program.

Please make sure your child is at school on time each day. It is important that students are well-rested and eat a healthy breakfast to help them do their best. Winter Band Concert

Please drop your student off at the HS AUDITORIUM Circle Drive entrance (DOOR 1) - Not the North Entrance... between 7:15 and 7:20 am. All students will be transported from the HS to their building after our rehearsal. Because this is our only chance to rehearse with all 173 students together, it is VERY important that every Band student attend this rehearsal! The students have been working extremely hard to prepare for this big concert. We hope you will attend.




Fourth Grade Music Program

Morning Car Drop Off Reminders

All students arriving to school as car riders are **expected** to be dropped off in the back parking lot. For everyone's safety please be sure to follow the following procedures for drop off.

- Pull up in the lane closest to the building, next to the side walk.
- The first car should pull up and stop at the start of the sidewalk (just past the corner of the gym). The next car in line should pull up directly behind the car in front of them and continue this pattern the length of the side walk. Our goal is to get as many cars off of 29th as possible and to unload the full length of the sidewalk at one time.
- Students will exit from the passenger side of the vehicle. Staff will be on duty to help students if needed.
- Drivers will remain in the car.
- All cars next to the sidewalk and all the way back to where the side walk ends will have students exit the vehicles safely then pull forward in line (do not pull around other cars) around the corner to the back lane to exit the parking lot.
- Please be alert to the staff on duty, helping children exiting vehicles, as they may indicate that students can exit before your vehicle reaches the sidewalk.
- Students should not be dropped off in the front parking lot.
- If after 8:00 AM students will need an adult to walk them into the building to sign them in for the day.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding of our morning drop off procedures. We want all of our students, families, and staff safe during the busy drop off time.
