VOTING INFORMATION

Linn-Mar Families,

As many of you may be aware, school board elections have been moved from their traditional September date to the general election date in November. This is the first year under this new format. Election day is Tuesday, November 5th. There are two Linn-Mar related topics on the ballot this year:

- <u>Linn-Mar School Board</u>: We are fortunate to have eight people running to serve on the school board. It is vital for us to have strong leadership as a district, and we are thankful to have such a great candidate pool. The following candidates are running for the Linn-Mar Board of Education:
 - 2-Year Term (You can vote for 1 candidate): Tim Isenberg
 - 4-Year Term (You can vote for up to 4 candidates): Sondra Nelson, Clark Weaver, Bob Gabel, Barry Buchholz, LaSheila Yates, Brittania Morey, and Jeff Wisdo
- <u>Revenue Purpose Statement</u>: Last spring, Governor Reynolds signed into law an extension of Secure an Advanced Vision for Education (SAVE). SAVE allows Linn-Mar, and all public school districts in the state, the opportunity to borrow against the money each district would receive through the statewide penny sales tax levy for schools. These funds are used to pay for school infrastructure projects. However, before Linn-Mar can use the funding for long-term projects, the voters must approve a new Revenue Purpose Statement (RPS).
 - Please note that a 'vote yes' for the Revenue Purpose Statement does not raise property taxes and a 'vote no' for the Revenue Purpose Statement does not lower property taxes.
 - Passage of the RPS simply allows the district to use the funds that the legislature previously approved.
 - The ballot is two-sided this year. So, don't forget to flip your ballot to vote on the Revenue Purpose Statement.

November Library News!




We have many students on the journey to different planets for the ICCA Deep Space Challenge! Way to go, space readers! Students in 3-5 can choose any lowa Children's Choice Award winning book to read, complete the Reading Counts test with 70% or better and fill out a google form for Mrs. Clanin, then move along the eight planets to reach Deep Space! We will celebrate our space journey in the spring!


K-2 students have been enjoying Goldfinch Award winning books, learning the basics of digital citizenship and having mini reading celebrations. Kindergarten read <u>The Dot</u> by Peter Reynolds and made collaborative dots that are hanging in the library. First graders read <u>The Library Mouse</u> by Daniel Kirk and are really excited about being authors and illustrators of mouse-sized books to put in our library. I have a pocket chart just the right size for holding these so others can read the stories! Second graders read <u>A Little Dog with a Big Heart: Gobi</u>, a true story by Dion Leonard and then used Google Earth to look for the Gobi Desert and other famous places. We probably found your house, too.

Third graders took part in conversations surrounding the book <u>Each</u> <u>Kindness</u> by Jacqueline Woodson about how we act in person and on devices is a responsibility. Digital citizenship is part of being a good citizen and moved onto a collection of digital citizenship games by Common Sense Media called Digital Passport.

Fourth graders have started using Typingclub.com during library class to brush up on their keyboarding skills. This is a program they can access online at home, if there is a keyboard waiting to be typed on! Third graders will start TypingClub after Christmas break.

Fourth and Fifth graders read a story called <u>But I Read it on the Internet</u> and then became web detectives to evaluate four websites to see which ones are real and which ones are fake. We've also started sharing the books we are reading because that's the best way to pick out your next favorite reads! Bennie is our new BenQ interactive panel that we use for instruction and collaboration in the library. He is gaining quite a reputation for being a pretty cool computer! Bennie was purchased for the library with a spring Linn-Mar Foundation Grant that was awarded to Bowman Woods.

"PARADE OF BANDS" CONCERT:

On Tuesday, November 19th, the BOWMAN WOODS/ECHO HILL/WESTFIELD (Westside) Bands will have their first concert. The program will be held in the Linn-Mar High School Auditorium and begin at **6:00 PM**. The concert will include performances by the Westside 5th Grade Band, the Oak Ridge MS 6th Grade Band, and the Linn-Mar HS Symphonic Band. The concert should last about one hour. We ask that students arrive at the High School between **5:30 – 5:45 PM**. All Band students should report to the HS Little Theatre for instructions before proceeding to the stage. *Please* have students wear nice dress clothes for this major performance. A free will donation can be made at the door.

In preparation for the concert, we will be practicing together that **MORNING** (Nov. 19th) at **L-M HS.** Please **drop your student off** at the HS Auditorium entrance Door 1 (from 10th Street, turn into the South Lot by the digital L-M sign that's between the HS and the LRC, then turn left to the Door 1 circle drive) between 8:00 and 8:10 am for our 8:15 – 9:00 am morning rehearsal. It is *very important* that your student attend this rehearsal. Students will be bused to school after the rehearsal. Percussion, baritone and tuba instruments will already be at the HS. All other students should bring their instruments and Band music.

Please note - With winter approaching, please remember that if there is a weather-related LATE START, Group Band WILL NOT meet - but students should still bring instruments to school for lessons.
